

Matthew 6:9-10, 13 (NASB)

9 "Pray, then, in this way:

'Our Father who is in heaven, Hallowed be Your name. ¹⁰ 'Your kingdom come. Your will be done, On earth as it is in heaven. . .

13 . . . For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.'



God as a personal father

Isaiah 63:16 (NASB) – prophetic

For You are our Father, though Abraham does not know us And Israel does not recognize us. You, O LORD, are our Father,

Our Redeemer from of old is Your name.

Luke 2:49 (NASB) – Jesus at the age of 12

And He said to them, "Why is it that you were looking for Me? Did you not know that I had to be in My Father's *house*?"

God's Kingdom foretold to David

1 Chronicles 17:11-14 (NASB)

¹¹ When your days are fulfilled that you must go to be with your fathers, that I will set up one of your descendants after you, who will be of your sons; and I will establish his kingdom. 12 He shall build for Me a house, and I will establish his throne forever. 13 I will be his father and he shall be My son; and I will not take My lovingkindness away from him, as I took it from him who was before you. 14 But I will settle him in My house and in My kingdom forever, and his throne shall be established forever.""

The Kingdom prophesied by Isaiah

Isaiah 9:6-7 (NASB)

⁶ For a child will be born to us, a son will be given to us; And the government will rest on His shoulders; And His name will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace.

⁷There will be no end to the increase of *His* government...

Jesus announces the arrival of the Kingdom

Mark 1:14-15 (NASB)

¹⁴... Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of God, ¹⁵ and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel."

Luke 8:1 (NIV)

Jesus traveled about from one town and village to another, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God.

Jesus tells us to "seek first" the Father's kingdom

Matthew 6: 33

Seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

Kingdom:

A *kingdom* is a territory or group of people ruled by the same monarch.



Jesus told His disciples to preach the kingdom

Matthew 10:7 (NASB)

And as you go, preach, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.'

Luke 9:2 (NASB)

And He sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to perform healing.

The Kingdom of Heaven and the Kingdom of God are one and the same

Matthew 13:31-32 (NASB) He presented another parable to them, saying, "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed. . .

Mark 4:30-31 (NASB) "How shall we picture the kingdom of God, or by what parable shall we present it? ³¹ *It is* like a mustard seed,....



Matthew 28:18-19 (NASB)

Jesus came up and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations. . ."



Peter's Message at Pentecost – Acts 2

²³ this *Man* . . . you nailed to a cross by the hands of godless men and put *Him* to death. ²⁴ But God raised Him up again, putting an end to the agony of death, since it was impossible for Him to be held in its power. . .

No explanation of why Jesus died

32 This Jesus God raised up again, to which we are all witnesses.

Emphasis on Resurrection

Peter's message at Pentecost – continued

³³ Therefore having been exalted to the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, He has poured forth this which you both see and hear.

34... 'THE LORD SAID TO MY LORD, "SIT AT MY RIGHT HAND,

35 UNTIL I MAKE YOUR ENEMIES A FOOTSTOOL FOR YOUR FEET."

Declares that Jesus has been exalted to the Right Hand of God and received and poured forth the Holy Spirit

Peter's message at Pentecost – continued

Therefore let all the house of Israel know for certain that God has made Him both Lord and Christ—this Jesus whom you crucified."...

³⁸... "Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Declares that Jesus is now Lord and Christ. Peter tells people to repent and be baptised About 3000 responded!




Jesus's progression to the throne

- 1. Came revealing God as a personal Father
- 2. Preached the Kingdom of God
- 3. Instructed His disciples to preach the kingdom of God
- 4. Died on the Cross
- 5. Conquered death, rose from the grave, and met with his followers
- 6. Advised all authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Him
- 7. Ascended into heaven
- 8. Sat down at the Father's right hand
- 9. Awaits all enemies to be made a footstool for His feet








2. Elite force stealthily enters and takes control

2 Samuel 5:6-10 (NASB) . . . the Jebusites said to David, "You shall not come in here . . . the blind and lame will turn you away" . . . nevertheless, David captured the stronghold of Zion, . . . through the water tunnel."



Jesus took out Satan's power centre

Romans 5:6 (NIV) . . . at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly.

Hebrews 2:14 (NASB) . . . that through death He might render powerless him who had the power of death, that is, the devil

Matthew 28:18 (NASB) "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth.

Colossians 2:15 (NASB) When He had disarmed the rulers and authorities, He made a public display of them, having triumphed over them through Him.

We are now an occupying army expanding the kingdom that Jesus established.

Acts 2:34-35 . . . 'THE LORD SAID TO MY LORD, "SIT AT MY RIGHT HAND, ³⁵ UNTIL I MAKE YOUR ENEMIES A FOOTSTOOL FOR YOUR FEET."

Isaiah 9:7 There will be no end to the increase of *His* government

Ephesians 6:12 For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world forces of this darkness, against the spiritual *forces* of wickedness in the heavenly *places*.

2 Corinthians 10:4 for the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh, but divinely powerful for the destruction of fortresses.





Paul's preaching

Acts 28:30-31 (NASB)

³⁰ And he stayed two full years in his own rented quarters and was welcoming all who came to him, ³¹ preaching the kingdom of God and teaching concerning the Lord Jesus Christ with all openness, unhindered.

Romans 10:9-10 (NASB) that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; ¹⁰ for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation.

- 1. confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord,
- 2. believe in your heart God raised Him from the dead,
- 3. with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness,
- 4. with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation.

Romans 5:10 . . . while we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life.

Colossians 2:13 When you were dead in your transgressions . . . He made you alive together with Him, having forgiven us all our transgressions,

Romans 8:37 (NIV). . . in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.



In Ephesians 1:16-21, Paul prays (paraphrased)

- that the Father of glory, may give to you a spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of Him.
- that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened,
- that you will know what is the hope of His calling
 - the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints
 - the surpassing greatness of His power toward us who believe.

Which is in accordance with the working of the strength of His might brought about in Christ, when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places, far above

- all rule and authority and
- power and dominion, and
- every name that is named

- Swamping us with negative media reports so we lose sight of the truth about God's Kingdom




Some Reasons why we struggle

- 2. Negative Spiritual influences resulting from trauma
- 3. God wants us to experience victory through Christ and allows trials and challenges to develop our character
 - Fruit takes time to mature
