We came to realise forgiveness is most often the first step to a victorious life. Unforgiveness is like drinking poison and expecting the other person to die

Jesus taught his disciples to "pray like this:"

- ⁹ . . . 'Our Father in heaven! May your Name be kept holy.
- ¹⁰ May your Kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven.
- ¹¹ Give us the food we need today.
- ¹² Forgive us what we have done wrong, as we too have forgiven those who have wronged us.
- ¹³ And do not lead us into hard testing, but keep us safe from the Evil One. For kingship, power and glory are yours forever.
 - Amen.' Matthew 6:9-13 Complete Jewish Bible

Jesus went on to say

¹⁴ For if you forgive others their offenses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you; ¹⁵ but if you do not forgive others their offenses, your heavenly Father will not forgive yours. Matthew 6:14-15 Complete Jewish Bible



When asked a question on the 10 Commandments

²⁹ Jesus answered, "The foremost is, 'Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is one Lord; 30 and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' 31 The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." Mark 12:29-31 (NASB 1995)

CS Lewis in "Mere Christianity" explains

"loving your neighbour as yourself" involves

- Forgiving your neighbour in the way you forgive yourself.
- Just as we do things that we are not proud of and then forgive ourselves for doing them so we should be prepared to forgive those who offend us even though we may not like what they have done or are doing.

We don't need to like everything they do but we can still love them!

So, How much have we been forgiven?

God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

Romans 5:8 (NASB 1995)

If you're brave enough watch the film "The Passion" – it graphically portrays the love of Jesus and what it cost Him to forgive us



1 Corinthians 11:23-26 Complete Jewish Bible

23 . . . that the Lord Yeshua, on the night he was betrayed, took bread; ²⁴ and after he had made the b'rakhah he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you. Do this as a memorial to me"; 25 likewise also the cup after the meal, saying, "This cup is the New Covenant effected by my blood; do this, as often as you drink it, as a memorial to me." ²⁶ For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord, until he comes.

1 Corinthians 11 (continued vs 27-30)

²⁷ Therefore, whoever eats the Lord's bread or drinks the Lord's cup in an unworthy manner will be guilty of desecrating the body and blood of the Lord! 28 So let a person examine himself first, and then he may eat of the bread and drink from the cup; 29 for a person who eats and drinks without recognizing the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself. 30 This is why many among you are weak and sick, and some have died!

³⁰ And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. ³¹ **Get rid of all** bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. ³² Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you. Ephesians 4:30-32 (NIV)
